
Ladies Night Out

3:30 on Sunday, 6 January





What you need:


- ½ cup chopped, crushed candied pecans






Family faith challenge guidelines for the year


- Worship God together once a week

CBS to air Odyssey Networks production on Christmas Eve

Like so many of America's once bustling industrial centers, Reading, PA, has been on a downward spiral for decades. The city has lost factories, jobs and population. The latest economic recession amplified its burdens.

Something that Reading has never lost, however, is hope—hope and an abiding belief in the power of community.

Odyssey Network's One Christmas Story: People Rich in Spirit takes viewers to the heart of Reading for a celebration that reflects the true meaning of the holiday season—hope and caring.

One Christmas Story: People Rich in Spirit begins in the aptly-named Hope Lutheran Church, a symbol of hope in Reading's poorest neighborhood. There a diverse congregation gathers on Christmas Eve 2012 to share the joyful songs of the season and to hear the story of the birth of Christ. Four local choirs join the congregation in song, reflecting the diversity of the community.



Woven through the music and the readings are the stories of Reading citizens today—stories that illustrate the messages of the Gospel: sharing with neighbors, valuing the spiritual over the

material, and welcoming the stranger.

Also featured in this Christmas special is a gathering, hosted by the Salvation Army, for Reading citizens-both the needy and those who are reaching out to help with a warm welcome, shelter, food, and holiday




gifts. The parallels are striking between this gathering and the time-honored images from the Christmas story itself-the weary


