

Pastor Kim's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the corner of my dining room sits a grandmother clock, brought from Germany by my grandmother who obtained it from family there and then passed it down to me. I grew up with this clock, fascinated by the deep tones of its chimes, echoing in the big chamber against the beautiful wood. I was so accustomed to the sound that at one point it sat in my bedroom, right next to my bed; and though people on the other side of telephone conversations would ask what all the noise was, not once did it disturb my sleep or routine.

Until it stopped.

After moving into my current house, the clock started to miss time: something was wrong. Although I had never had it serviced before, a repairman was called and serviced it; but it was no better. Then, one morning while I was upstairs, there was a huge crash. At first I could not find what had fallen, till looking in my beloved clock to see that a link in the chain had broken, releasing the weight to fall, breaking the bottom of the case.

One link, and the clock was damaged, never to be the same again.

Its funny about churches: no matter how large or small, people tend to sit in the same spot when they participate. A hole is left at that section of seating when a person is not there. At a ministry event, I watch the leader looking around, a head bobbing up to look over just to see, just to wait, if one more person is coming. A church is not an institution or a building: it is a group of people, united as a family through sharing the same heavenly Father, together in belief and

ministry. Together each one of us holds us all together, each a link that allows the church as a whole to echo the sounds of God's love to those far away and those right up close. We get so used to the way things work over the years that the ministry becomes normative for us, hardly noticeable to us as they tick away in the background of our lives.

Until they stop.

Pastors can be called and with council members offer service, and it can be better: but it is the links that hold the ministries together. The links, the members, the brothers and sisters: you.

You. Big, little, old, young – you – are a necessary part to the ministry of God through Christ's United.

In this season of Lent, as we approach the resounding trumpets and voices of joy at Easter, take a little time to look at the condition of your faith and ministry. Take the time to service and nurture yourself through worship and prayer. Take the time to realize exactly how important you are to the ministry of God here and now. Because even though we may take it for granted, those who we served are damaged when the weight of ministries broken falls upon them.

Grab hold. Take the hand of those next to you, those others who stand ready to serve and grow, and be linked together by God's call to be His church. Together sound forth loud and strong, echoing so

that generations past, present, and future can hear the beautiful chimes of God's ever present love.



500,000 QUILTS FOR LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF CHALLENGE

LWR has been distributing quilts around the world for many years. In 2012, they shared 412,710 quilts with needy people. The quilts are used as beds and/or covers, shawls, baby carriers, sunshades, and ground cover for market goods. The need continues so LWR has challenged the United States Lutherans to donate 500,000 in 2013.



Our cluster hopes to create several tied/knotted quilts and your help and donations are needed.

New or used but clean materials needed for the project are:

Bed sheets, blankets, mattress pads, pillow cases, quilts (not knitted or crocheted),

fabric yards or pieces (cottons, corduroy, polyester knits, fleece), or draperies (no fiberglass content).

Crocheting thread for knotting.

Please look around your homes or second hand shops for any of these materials and place them in the box in the social hall next to the walk-in closet. Assembly of quilts will begin in April.



Gram-mom Nagle's Sour Cream Apple Pie Beryl Stitzer

5-6 Apples peeled (granny smith, macintosh)

1/2 pint sour cream

2/3 cup sugar

1 Tbsp. white vinegar

2 Tbsp. flour

Combine ingredients and pour over apples in unbaked crust. Dot with butter and sprinkle with cinnamon.

Bake at 375 until apples are tender.

Also good with peaches in place of apples.



Lent: Deepening our Faith

<u>Daily</u>: Members of Christ's United have written reflections on daily Bible readings to lead us along the journey of Lent. These daily devotionals are available on the tables in the hallway or in the church office. Please consider not only adding to your own devotion, but sharing a devotional booklet with a friend.

<u>Wednesdays</u>: We gather each Wednesday at 6:00 for a supper of soups and bread while we learn about Social Ministry's World Hunger programs. Having fed our bodies we then feed our souls with worship at 7:00 pm. The Choir will lead us in Holden Evening Prayer while our Bible readings and reflections remember Christ's words from the cross.

Seder: In just two years it has become a requested tradition of Christ's United to share in the Passover Meal, the Seder, on the Wednesday of Holy Week (27 March). According to the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, Passover is the celebration Jesus shared with His disciples prior to the crucifixion. Please watch the bulletin board to sign up.

The Three Days: Maundy Thursday begins the Tridium, a service which begins with Footwashing, Holy Communion, and the Stripping of the Altar. The service continues as we gather on Good Friday before an altar empty of decoration and the Procession and Adoration of the Cross. We leave in silence and gather again in the darkness, only to be filled with the light of the resurrection and Festive Holy Communion on Easter Dawn.

Easter Services: Services begin at 6:30 a.m. with the prophecies and new flame followed by an Easter Breakfast prepared by the Lutheran Church Men. A Festive Service of Holy Communion begins at 9:30 a.m. with anthems by the Choir and all the celebration we can offer as we praise the Risen Lord. Bring a friend!


