Pastor Kim's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In getting ready to write my newsletter article for this month, I pulled up the February calendar to see what was coming up. Birthdays. Lots and lots of birthdays. Oh sure, there are meetings and services and outings and deadlines, but what fills our life together? Birthdays!

How wonderful in the midst of all the business of being the church we can celebrate the church itself – our lives, come together in worship and ministry - daily celebrations of the gift God has given us in each other. And while we may put off the cake due to the years and the calories, we should not, could not, must not, put off the celebration.

Too frequently we fall into sadness and depression as we become overwhelmed by the things we did not or can not do, mistakes that had been made, or angry comments made by another. 
Church Council Highlights from December:

Crayon


Make heart-shaped crayons as a reminder that the things of God should be written on our hearts.

What you need:

- An adult to help
- Oven
- Oven mitt
- Heart-shaped silicon mold (available at craft stores)
- Old crayons

What you do:

- 1. Heat oven to 230 degrees.
- 2. Remove paper wrappers from crayons. (This is easier if you soak crayons in cool water first.)
- 3. Break crayons into small pieces. Place pieces into heart-shaped mold, filling them about two-thirds full.
- 4. Bake for 15 minutes or until crayons have completely melted.
- 5. When the heart-shaped crayons are cool, remove them from the mold.

What will you give up?During Lent, some Christians give up a luxury or vice as a form of self-denial or to practice self-control. Ultimately, such a sacrifice should benefit one's spiritual walk with Jesus, who gave everything.

A Missouri teenager decided to give up talking for Lent. Decklan Conway, 13, communicated through dry-erase boards, going through three markers in less than a week. Although he lost a few friends because he wouldn't talk, Decklan wrote, "I'm doing it for a greater purpose." He added, "God gave up his only Son for us. … What are you willing to give up?" ----

A worthy corollary to that question is "What will you take on?" What can you do for God's kingdom during this season of reflection and recommitment?



Ash Wednesday/Lent

Lent is a time of preparation before the Easter celebration that has been observed by Christians since the fourth century. The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts for 40 days. The forty days of Lent recall the 40 day fast of Jesus in the wilderness after his baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) and Moses' 40 day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28). It is a time of simplicity and preparation.

Our observance of Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, with services both at noon and 7:00 PM. Each service will include the Imposition of Ashes. We will together deepen our faith understanding through Wednesday night worship focusing on the last words of Christ. Prior to worship on Wednesdays will be our traditional soup and bread suppers (please sign up on the bulletin board) organized by the Social Ministry Committee. Then, after the Sunday of the Passion (Palm Sunday), we will enter the Tridium – the three days – beginning in worship on Maundy Thursday with Foot Washing and Holy Communion, continuing Good Friday with the Procession and Adoration of the Cross, and coming to a climatic conclusion with the Easter Vigil leading into Easter Dawn on Sunday morning. Please join us at all of these services.

LWR has been distributing quilts around the world for many years. In 2012, they shared 412,710 quilts with needy people. The quilts are used as beds and/or covers, shawls, baby carriers, sunshades, and ground



cover for market goods. The need continues so LWR has challenged the United States Lutherans to donate 500,000 in 2013. Our CU hopes to create several tied/knotted quilts and your help and donations are needed.

New or used but clean materials needed for the project are:

Bed sheets, blankets, mattress pads, pillow cases, quilts (not knitted or crocheted),

fabric yards or pieces (cottons, corduroy, polyester knits, fleece), or draperies (no fiberglass content).

Crocheting thread for knotting.
