ear Creek Camp's residential program, for children who have completed grades 1-12, is a traditional camp program centered on spiritual growth, outdoor living and small group development. Each age group experiences a mix of small-group and all-camp activities throughout their week to meet their group's spiritual, social and developmental needs.

WHAT DO WE DO AT CAMP?

TRY CAMP

(COMPLETED GRADES 1 - 2)

This 3-day program is designed specifically for young children who want to try camp for the first time. Try Camp introduces campers to sleepover camp, allowing for all the fun of camp in a condensed format. Campers will learn about Jesus through many fun and exciting activities like Bible Study, singing, swimming, hiking, meeting new friends and much more! Campers sleep in comfortable cabins with modern bath facilities. Up to five other campers and a caring counselor help to make the cabin feel like home. You can choose: Block A – Sunday, 3 p.m. to Wednesday, 9 a.m. OR Block B – Wednesday, 3 p.m. to Saturday, 9 a.m.

JUNIORS (COMPLETED GRADES 2 - 4)

This full-week program is designed specifically for younger children who want to spend an entire week at camp. This program gives campers opportunities to learn more about Jesus as a part of a group. Campers sleep in comfortable cabins with modern bath facilities. Up to seven other campers and a caring counselor help to make the cabin feel like home.

MIDDLERS

(COMPLETED GRADES 5 - 6)

This full-week program is designed to help campers develop their sense of adventure and decision-making skills while growing in their faith with God. Campers sleep in platform tents centered around a program building that provides group meeting space and bath facilities. Up to seven other campers and a caring counselor help to make their tent feel like home (minus electricity). Campers participate in Bible Studies and group activities that encourage them to work together, as well as having opportunities to interact with others from Middlers and Junior High groups, choosing activities that interest them.

JUNIOR HIGH

(COMPLETED GRADES 7 - 8)

This full-week program is designed to help campers further develop their relationship with Christ through Bible Study, teamwork events and adventurous activities. Campers sleep in platform tents centered around a program building that provides group meeting space and bath facilities. They also experience one overnight exploration of camp. Up to seven other campers and a caring counselor help to make their tent feel like home (minus electricity). Campers will gain self-confidence, see old and new friends, and have opportunities to interact with others from Junior High and Middlers groups, choosing activities that interest them.

SENIORS

(COMPLETED GRADES 9-11)

This full-week program is designed to help campers grow and live out their faith through Bible Studies and other activities as well as develop their sense of adventure and outdoor living skills. Most of the week, campers sleep in platform tents centered around a program building that provides group meeting space and bath facilities. They also experience one overnight exploration of camp. Stay tuned for more information on a special High School-focused week!



CONFIRMATION GROUPS:

Confirmation groups are welcome during any week of camp this summer. The daily schedule will be adjusted to accommodate time for the Confirmation group to meet for Bible study alongside with regular camp activities. Bible studies may be led by the Pastor, or counselors can provide the summer Bible study. This is a great way for a Confirmation group to grow closer to God and each other as they discuss their faith and what it means to be confirmed.

Session 8 campers will experience the spiritual growth and fun of Classic Camp while also venturing out from Bear Creek Camp for a thrilling day of rafting.
