



#### **Pastor Kim's Message**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"Lord God, heavenly king, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory..." "Our Father who art in heaven..." "Let the vineyards be fruitful Lord, fill to the brim our cup of blessing..."

You might have kept going after the intro's above: we know those songs and the Lord's Prayer so well, having said them throughout our lives each week when we gather in Sunday worship and as we pray... we can say them without looking, without thinking, and even without feeling...

Its not just us; the people of ancient Israel also had become used to their worship and faith routines. In response the prophet Isaiah carried to them these words:

The Lord said: Because these people draw near with their mouths and honor me with their lips, while their hearts are far from me, and their worship of me is a human commandment learned by rote; Isaiah 29:13-14

Words Jesus then repeated to the disciples and followers recorded in Matthew 15, as they were so accustomed to the "how's" of doing things that they lost touch with the "why's". They had lost the feeling – the passion – of being in love with God, and it showed in their words, in their understanding, and in their daily lives.

We will begin by committing ourselves to prayer, conversation with our Lord, and grow by connecting each part of our lives to the source of life, Jesus Christ.

Please open your heart. Join with us this week and every week and learn the wonder of those old words. Learn to live in the wonder of God's love.




## **Church Council Highlights from August:**




To the Congregation of Christ's United,


