Pastor Kim's Message

The Pastor's Part -

This is my last article for the newsletter as the pastor of this congregation. By the time it will be published my office will be emptied and the pulpit filled by a supply pastor. It is a time of mixed emotions for me, and for the congregation.

Ironically my leaving coincides with my arrival: both the first sermon preached and announcement of departure were in Lent, one week (and six years!) apart. For the first four years I commuted between my home in Robesonia and Airport Road. Two years ago I moved into a house in Germanville after renovating the house and building a garage, finally ending my hour – or more - commute. While the reasons for my departure were shared more fully with the congregation, it was not planned, nor am I going to another congregation. My departure is based in a question of identity and purpose.

Perhaps ironically, this year, 2017, is the 25th anniversary of Christ's United Lutheran Church being in its building. The new building – a single building – forever changed the future of ministry for the congregation, ending a history of individual chapels and creating a single worshipping community. The event was filled with struggle, more than question over a building: it was question of identity and purpose. Some questions still need to be answered...

In the very beginning of the building process the congregation had two pastors, the first of eight. The last two pastors were with the congregation for 15 years, with a one year vacancy between them, meaning six pastors were there for less than nine years: less than two years each (one and a half actually, though the average tenure of an ELCA pastor is 8.32 years). Why does this matter? Because the growth and stability of a congregation is directly linked to the length of time the pastor has been there. And people – whether pastors or members of the congregation – tend to stay longer when there is a clear understanding of identity and purpose.

It was the very first time I entered the building that I saw the Mission Statement hanging on the wall. The words burned in me – how could they not? – as I had never seen a Mission Statement like this before. But identity and purpose are not shared through words on paper: identity and purpose are seen in the life of the congregation. How people treat others. How people welcome others. How people respect others.

Do you want your identity and purpose to be defined by recent events? The history of the congregation is one of division: at this moment is the opportunity to forever change the future of this congregation, this community, and the greater church.

At this moment, this congregation has the opportunity to forever change the course of history.

How? By talking with each other.

Honestly talking about what has happened, bringing to light things that have happened in darkness, and forming a clear understanding of identity and purpose for the congregation, its ministries, and its pastors. By holding up that understanding and purpose whenever unrest arises, dealing with, not dismissing, the unrest as those who *are* united in Christ.

Although my time has been ended, I pray that my absence is enough to cause the conversation to begin.

May peace be in you.

- 1) Sue Herb was hired as the Indoor Custodian.
- 2) After much discussion with the members of Christ's United present, the council reluctantly accepted Pastor Kim's resignation.
- 3) Pastor Shankweiler was then asked to set up a candidate for the intentional interim post for approximately 1 year in order to help promote healing before a new minister would be called.
- 4) Pastor Kim's pension was discussed and we are waiting to hear about the interest before this can be corrected. She also will be paid according to accumulated vacation days and continuing education owed to her.
- 5) Pastor Kim's last working day at Christ's United is March 27.
- 6) Gregg Sterling's council position has been filled by Terry Shilling according to the constitution of Christ's United Lutheran Church.

March's council Member of the month is Angie Berger.

Expanding our view of service

We often think of serving in terms of Matthew 25: supplying food and clothing; caring for the sick, incarcerated and other "least of these" members of society — serving Jesus in the process. But we also can serve him with our unique talents and by doing things we love.



For example, Ged King, a barber in England, devotes some of his time off to giving homeless people free haircuts. Imagine Jesus saying, "For my hair was long and scraggly, and you cut it" — or "My heart was lonely, and you played music to lift my spirits. I could no longer read small print, and you read to me. I have to work two jobs, and you invited my child to spend afternoons crafting with you. My car broke down, and you repaired it." Then the King will say, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father ... whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:34, 40, NIV; emphasis added).




