

VICTOR'S CROSS — Also called the conqueror's cross, the victor's cross is composed of the Greek cross, recognized by its four equal arms, adorned with Greek letters in each quadrant. The top left letters stand for *Jesus* and the top right letters stand for *Christ* (the horizontal lines above them indicate that they are abbreviations). The four letters across the bottom spell the Greek word for *conqueror*.

Message from Designated Pastor Mindy...

He is risen indeed!

I love that traditional Easter greeting, and I use it liberally. So when I answered the phone that way on the third day of Easter and the gruff voice on the other end replied, "It's Tuesday!" all I could do was laugh—and reply, "what—so he isn't risen anymore?"

Easter isn't over, folks, in fact we're just warming up. There are seven weeks of Easter, and then comes Pentecost! It gets better and better not only did Jesus rise, he also ascended (so as to be everywhere) and sent the Holy Spirit (the comforter, the one who helps us keep on keeping' on)!

So how to keep the celebration happening?

Be a little silly (a root of that word means "blessed," so own it!). Buy some Easter treats now that they're on sale, and break them out in a few weeks. It's never too late for an Easter egg hunt (assuming you're using plastic eggs).

But keep celebrating real Easter, too. Learn a new Easter hymn: you have lots of time to practice it. Say or sing, "Alleluia," every chance you get. Put the same energy into prayers of thanksgiving and celebration that you put into penance and solemnity during Lent. Pray for those you always pray for, but add prayers of thanksgiving for what God has given them and what they have given you.

Live your new life as fully as you can.

The last time I wrote a message for our newsletter it was October, and we were preparing to enter the Fall Season. Now we have entered Spring, with another new season dawning upon us! I love all four seasons! I love watching the changes that each new season brings. God is constantly ready to surprise us, and we don't have to look far to be in awe of what God is doing in our world! Isn't it exciting?



As I write this, Easter is a week away. By the time you read it we will have celebrated Jesus's resurrection. He will have spent his "3 days in the tomb." (I always have to ponder that a bit—He was crucified and buried on Friday, spent Saturday in the tomb, and arose early Sunday morning!) But God can keep time differently than we do, can't he? 

The Psalms have some beautiful images of God bringing forth new life! So many Psalms give us words to praise God. I searched for some Psalms that describe the new life of Spring. I know there are many more, and I am sure there are better images of new life from God. I was inspired by Psalm 148. Here are some parts of that chapter.

Praise the Lord! Praise the Lord from the heavens; Praise him in the heights! Praise him sun and moon; praise him all you shinning stars! Praise the Lord from the earth; Mountains and all hills, fruit trees and all cedars!

In Psalm 147 I found: Sing to the Lord with Thanksgiving; make melody to our God on the lyre. He covers the heavens with clouds, prepares rain for the earth, makes grass grow on the hills.

In Psalm 104 we find: You make springs gush forth in the valleys; they flow between the hills, giving drink to every wild animal. From your lofty abode you water the mountains; the earth is satisfied with the fruit of your work. You cause the grass to grow for the cattle and the plants for people to use, to bring forth food from the earth, and wine to gladden the human heart, and bread to strengthen the human heart.

O Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures. These all look to you in due season; when you give to them they gather it up; when you open your hand, they are filled with good things. When you send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the ground. May the glory of the Lord endure forever; may the Lord rejoice in his works.

All of God's creation sings praises to him! Can we do less? Let's close with the opening verses of Psalm 92:



Resurrection rumblings

In *Easter Earthquake*, James A. Harnish explores the "earthshaking promise" of Jesus' resurrection. Easter Sunday "shatters the power of fear," he writes. "Because Christ is risen, we no longer allow fear to dominate, control or manipulate us. We don't remain imprisoned in the tombs of our past failures or buried under the weight of present anxiety. In the risen Christ, old things pass away and everything becomes new."

Easter, Harnish adds, is proof that God hasn't forsaken us and is present among us. "The Resurrection contradicts the assumption that Christ resides on an ethereal cloud in a distant heaven. Rather, we find him on the dusty road that leads to the real stuff of our ordinary world."

Jesus' followers can find him everywhere, Harnish concludes. "The risen Christ will meet us along the confused, chaotic, fearful paths of our lives and speak the same words the women hear at the tomb, 'Do not be afraid.'"

The joy that Jesus offers his disciples is his own joy, which flows from his intimate communion with the One who sent him. It is a joy that does not separate happy days from sad days, successful moments from moments of failure, experiences of honor from experiences of dishonor, passion from resurrection.



This joy is a divine gift that does not leave us during times of illness, poverty, oppression or persecution. It is present even when the world laughs or tortures, robs or maims, fights or kills. It is truly ecstatic, always moving us away from the house of fear into the house of love, and always proclaiming that death no longer has the final say, though its noise remains loud and its devastation visible. The joy of Jesus lifts up life to be celebrated.
