

#### The Recipe Swap

This month's recipe: Taco Soup Submitted by Deb Price.



#### TACO SOUP

1 cup diced onion

1 cup diced red / green pepper

3 cloves garlic

2 lbs. ground beef

2 cans diced tomatoes

1 can Dakota beans (black beans)

1 can chili beans / kidney beans

1 tsp cilantro

1 can of corn

1 (10 oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chilies

1 pkg. taco mix

In a large sauté pan add ground beef, onions, peppers, and garlic stirring frequently for 15 to 20 minutes until beef is fully cooked. Place all ingredients except corn into a soup pot. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to a low simmer. Add corn and summer for about 20 minutes. Serve with shredded cheese and corn chips.


The next WELCA gathering will be AUGUST 1st at 6:00pm for the Annual Indoor Covered Dish Picnic.

#### The supplies for each School Kit are:

- Four 70 sheet spiral notebooks
- One 30 centimeter ruler (or with inches and centimeters)
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with steel blades)
- One box of 16-24 crayons
- One 2 1/2 inch eraser
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- One sturdy drawstring back style cloth bag (14" x 17")




