




You can stop there, and I bet you'll be refreshed and uplifted. If you're having a good time, dig deeper. Go to the indexes. Look up hymns from different places and times, or multiple hymns by the same writer or composer. Look up the stories behind hymns. Some will amaze you!

Member's Message from Vivian Brown...

Jabez was honored more than his brothers; and his mother named him Jabez, saying, "Because I bore him in pain." Jabez called on the God of Israel, saying, "Oh that you would bless me and enlarge my border, and that your hand might be with me, and that you would keep me from



hurt and harm!: And God granted what he asked. *I Chronicles 4:9-10*


In the midst of I Chronicles, we find the prayer of a man named Jabez. The chapters and verses prior to, and immediately following are taken up with the official family tree of the Hebrew tribes. Name after name after name after name. Frankly, it can get a bit boring. But then we come to verse 9. All of a sudden (or at least it seems that way to me), Jabez is named. Immediately after verse 10, we are back to reading name after name after name after name (cue the boredom!). So why the pause for a prayer of a man who is mentioned <u>one</u> time in the entire Bible? I believe it's because Jabez wasn't afraid to pray BIG. Why not ask for more to do for God? Why not ask God to be with you? Why not ask God for safety and peace?

This is a powerful prayer that greatly affected Jabez's life. God granted what he asked. That should coms as no surprise to any of us. God is a merciful and gracious God. He wants to bless us with good things. Even if we have no words for a prayer, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words *(see Romans 8:26).*

I pray this prayer each time I leave my driveway and again before I fall asleep at night. I feel the blessings of God each and every day. Pray BIG, because God's answers are BIG.

Try this prayer or make up your own big prayer for a few weeks. Be bold. Be specific. Ask for God's blessings; His blessings never run out. Ask God to give you more work (not less) to do for Him. Ask God to be with you and guide you in His work; God does hold hands. Ask God to keep you from harm and evil.

During these dog days of August, enjoy God's blessing of creation, friendships, and brotherhood. Pray BIG. Wonderful things happen



Use simple ingredients and your imagination to bake these fluffy, cloud-like treats.

What you need:

- 3 egg whites
- ½ tsp. vanilla extract
- Mixer
- 1 Tbsp. cornstarch
- Parchment paper

What you do:

- 1. Preheat oven to 300°. In a mixing bowl, combine egg whites and vanilla. Mix at medium speed until frothy.
- 2. While whisking, gradually add sugar and cornstarch. Keep whisking at high speed until stiff peaks form.
- 3. Spoon mixture onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Create fun shapes.
- 4. Bake 20 minutes. Cool and enjoy!

School Kits needed for Lutheran World Relief

Items may be brought in August 6 thru 27.

Education is important in every community but especially those where poverty or disaster limits the options of young people looking to improve their lives. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children continue learning despite the hardships they face. These supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not.

The supplies for each School Kit are:

- Four 70 sheet spiral notebooks
- One 30 centimeter ruler (or with inches and centimeters)
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with steel blades)
- One box of 16-24 crayons
- One 2 1/2 inch eraser
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- One sturdy drawstring back style cloth bag (14" x 17")

In the coming weeks the school supplies will begin to be in stores (much to the dismay of many children and adults) at great low prices so keep these items in mind.

Donations of any of these items should be placed on the table in the Narthex August 6 - 27.


