

A merry balance

In Luke 10:38-42, Martha gets a bad rap. After all, we need Marthas to get things done and to show hospitality. (Note that Martha is the one who opens up her home to Jesus in the first place!)

Marthas are needed in December, but holiday preparations shouldn't shift our focus from the reason for the season. When we become "worried and distracted" as Martha did (v. 41, NRSV), we're tempted to trade God's "one thing" (v. 42) for the world's many worthless things. Yet if we're only like Mary, we may forget to let the world know who we're celebrating!

So this Christmas, keep a proper balance between your inner Mary and your inner Martha. Take time to "be Mary," kneeling at the manger, so that all the merry things you do as Martha have meaning and serve the newborn king.



By the time you are reading this, our family will be past a significant anniversary. Not an anniversary of celebration, but one that will give us pause to reflect how much changed - not just in an instant - but over the last year. It will be a time of sadness, remembering a lost loved one, and thankfulness for life and

healing. It also is a time to reflect on our faith and the healing hand of God on our girls.

On November 27, 2017, Ava, our niece Lilly, and mother/mother-in-law/grandmother Crystal were in a horrific car accident. Ava and Lilly survived with significant and life-threatening injuries; Crystal did not. The last year has been filled with differing emotions as we experienced grief at our family's loss, fear and sadness for the girls, and joy at every improvement and milestone through their recovery.

You all have helped us in so many ways, especially by praying for healing - both physical and emotional. The many kindnesses afforded to our family and the girls - whether visits, the monetary collection, cards & gifts, words of encouragement when needed most - each is cherished by all of us and we are truly grateful.

Ava will continue to attend medical appointments, for a yet undetermined length of time, to monitor the bone growth in her legs - making sure they are growing evenly. Lilly continues to heal, as her spinal damage was more significant than first thought, and will be monitored by her medical team. But, we rejoice at the recoveries they have made and pray for their continued progress.

We sincerely offer our thanks to each of you for your thoughts, prayers and other caring expressions during this most difficult experience.

The Recipe Swap

This month's recipe: Festive Cranberry Pineapple Salad Submitted by Deb Hall.



Festive Cranberry Pineapple Salad

Recipe Details

Yields: 14 1/2 cup servings

Ingredients

1 can (20 ounce) crushed pineapple in juice, undrained

2 (4 ounce) boxes raspberry flavored gelatin

1 can whole berry cranberry sauce

1 medium apple, chopped

2/3 cup chopped walnuts or pecans

Directions

- 1. Drain pineapple, reserving all liquid.
- 2. Add enough cold water to the reserved juice to make 3 cups liquid.
- 3. Bring to boil, remove from heat. Add gelatin, stir at least 2 minutes until completely dissolved.
- 4. Add cranberry sauce, stir until well blended..
- 5. Pour into bowl, refrigerate 1 1/2 hrs., or until slightly thickened, about the consistency of egg whites.
- 6. Stir in pineapple, apple, and nuts until well blended.
- 7. Transfer to serving bowl.
- 8. Chill 4 hrs. or until firm.

The annual Christmas meal will be held December 9th following the morning worship service. Stuffed chicken breasts,


