



ADVENT COLORS — One of the season's symbolic colors is blue, representing hope. During Advent, we wait in hope to celebrate again God's coming in human form. We also look forward in hope to Christ's coming in glory at the end of the age. Purple symbolizes the royalty of Jesus, the coming Prince of Peace, and the penitence with which we receive him. Some congregations also use pink or white candles in Advent wreaths, with pink symbolizing joy and white symbolizing the Christ Child.

Message from Pastor Brian

Grace and Peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!



I am excited to be on the Advent journey with you. I know this may sound strange, but the season of Advent, not Christmas, happens to be my favorite in the church.

Why is that? Largely because I feel like the time building up to a big event are always the most meaningful. And here, we get to prepare for Christ to come. And as we talk about preparing for the birth of Christ, in the church we also get to talk about what it is like for us to prepare for the all-time coming of Christ, when we expect our Savior to show up, close this era of creation, and usher in something new and wonderful.

So what does that look like for us? For us believers, it has very little to do with decorating our homes or putting up trees, though many (including myself) will do that. But for me at least, I think it's finding those moments of connection in our shared humanity. We prepare for the coming of Christ by looking for Jesus in those on the margins, by searching for Christ's love in our ministry for the poor and lonely.

Years ago, I took a group of kids from Trinity, Valley View to the Boys and Girls club in South Philadelphia, where they spent time interacting with kids in an after school program that served a number of elementary schools in that area of the city.

I watched as one particular child, who was from a fairly financially sound family, played with another child who was living in a homeless shelter. I asked about that boy's story with one of the associates there, and she told me that recently he and his sister were moved by their mother out of their home, fleeing an abusive situation.




But there in that moment, coming from two completely different backgrounds, being of different races, of different financial means, and from different levels of stability, they were just two boys racing scooters across a floor. None of that other stuff mattered. And I thought to myself, "this is what the kingdom of God looks like."

As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ, let us also search for foretastes of the feast to come, in our interactions with those we know as well as those we don't.



We invite anyone who has a craft whether it is knitting, crocheting, painting, drawing, coloring, weaving or any other handicraft to bring it in for display.







How much do you know about Jesus? Do you know of His life and ministry?

I challenge you through the month of December; take a journey with myself, and Luke, through the life of our Lord and Savior. During this time of the church calendar, we usually focus on Christ's birth. However, this year, let us also focus on why His birth is so significant.

If you have heard or read the Gospel of Luke, you know just how detailed he was as his Gospel truly corroborates the other Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and John. Additionally, Luke tells us about additional events in Jesus life including his early childhood.

Therefore, I issue to you the Gospel of Luke Challenge. There are twenty-four chapters in the Gospel of Luke. The challenge is this, each day between December 1 and December 24 read one chapter from the Gospel of Luke. By the time we get to Christmas Eve, we will have a better understanding of Jesus and his ministry. Maybe, by December 24, we will wholeheartedly praise God with the angels and declare, "Glory to god in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill toward men! (Luke 2:14)

As you read the Gospel, keep notes in a journal on specific highlights that stand out to you in the reading. That is the challenge, read and learn Jesus. Let's take this trip together through Luke's account of the life and ministry of our Lord, our Savior, the Messiah, the King!
