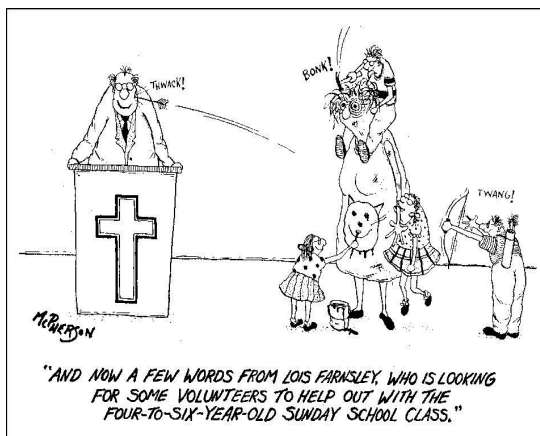

Grace and Peace to you from our Lord in this New Year!

Who are we as a church? I've been asking myself that for quite some time. I'm not just talking about CULC. I'm talking about the wider church as well. What defines us?

Is it faith in Jesus Christ? Or is it something else?

See, I've been thinking about this. The Financial Leadership Academy team has been discussing things. Our council has been discussing things. I invite all of us into this conversation. The next FLA meeting will be on January 12 at 6, and in the interest of transparency, I would like to invite anyone who would like to take part in the conversation.

Outreach is something we do very well here. I am proud of the work of the food pantry. I am looking at all of the good we are doing for who we are helping in our Christmas tree program. There are kids that wouldn't have a Christmas, but will have one, because of the work of Christ's United.

But we also know that the church has sizeable challenges.

Maybe the question isn't who do we want to be, but who does GOD want us to be? And how do we make that work in this world that sometimes seems very hostile?

Scripture reminds us of the early church's struggle. They lived in a world in which they were seen as the enemy, yet they were trying to provide the world with comfort and a sense of belonging. The early church was in part a mix of all kinds of people. Rich and poor, old and young, and people who were cast aside by the powers that be. The early Christians, some of them, were killed because of what they believed.

SHIP — The Christian church has long been symbolized by a ship. While the Old Testament tells of Noah's ark preserving righteous people during the flood, the New Testament recounts Jesus calming the storm that battered the disciples' fishing boat. St. Ambrose described the church as a ship with the cross as its mast, and others have compared salvation to being drawn out of the sea of death into the safety of the church (ship). Indeed, many large churches are constructed to represent a big boat, with the main worship space called the nave — Latin for ship.

And in whatever he does, he prospers

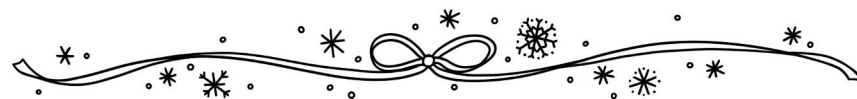

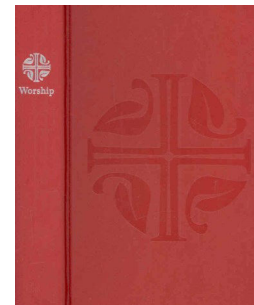

Evangelical Lutheran Worship Pew Edition



As the changing times have come, it has come time for us to transition to the newest hymnal. Released for the first time in 2007, *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* includes selections from the green LBW and blue With One Voice, in addition to all new settings. Included are the settings we at Christ’s United already use, in addition to ten other settings.

As time has progressed, the Sundays and Seasons programs we use in the office and for worship planning use more and more the ELW and not the green LBW. With this change, the time has come for us to make a switch. There will still be times we use hymns and settings from the green book.

We also are now worshipping using a projector, which means that we do not necessarily need one hymnal for each worship participant. Many of you use the books less and less and the screen more. Still, we need to have sufficient copies to meet copyright law standards.

You have an opportunity to sponsor the “new” (almost 20 years old) hymnal! Copies are \$26.50 each, and you can make your hymnal in honor or in memory of a loved one.

New Year, New Mercies


