

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I looked over the many the events scheduled this month at CULC, I honed in on the highway clean up slated for Saturday, October 13. What an important way to keep God's creation green as well as show the community our commitment to partnership with them in such care. Yet it can be a messy undertaking.

As I walked our dog Bailey in the cemetery of Friedens Church the other day, she irreverently did her business near a gravestone erected in the mid-1800s. As I bent to clean up the mess, the bag tore and doggie poop got all over my hand. My attempt to wipe it off on the grass was only moderately successful.

Messes such as these are an image for our lives. In Isaiah 64:6 the prophet says, "We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like filthy cloth". Isaiah chose filthy cloth carefully to refer to what we today would describe as a soiled sanitary product. Paul continues this theme in Romans 3; "There is no one who is righteous, not even one... (A)ll have sinned and fall short of the glory of God". Our noble attempts to clean up highways and after our pets cannot belie the fact that, as our Confession each week reminds us, "We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone." So there.

Yet for the Christian there is not despair, but rather the cross. Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 5:21, "For our sake he (God) made him (Jesus) to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." This is what Martin Luther called a "happy exchange"; Christ bears the sin of the world in his body and shares with us the righteousness he possesses as the very Son of God. Wow!

Crap happens, to paraphrase a bumper sticker. It gets on our hands and into our lives, tainting our relationships with God and others. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ (I Corinthians 15:57). Amen!

- General Checking Account Balance as of 7/31/18: \$ 37,223.39.
- Benevolence was \$1,161.00 with a total for the year of \$6,574.00 which is 43.7% of our goal.
- Choir will resume practice on 9/5 and begin singing on 9/9.
- Good & Faithful Servant Day/25th Anniversary of Building dinner tickets will be available for sale - \$10 for Adult / \$5 for children under 10 years of age.
- Pastor Laura's Installation Service will be held on October 7th at 4:00 p.m.
- Discretionary Fund this money used as a way to help those who come to the pastor for help regarding bills, heat, groceries, etc. Council approved opening this account for Pastor Laura to use as she sees fit for those in need.
- On Monday morning, August 6 both sets of front doors were found to be propped open. People who stop by the church must make sure that all doors are closed and securely locked when leaving the building. We still need members to call Deb Hall to tell her who has keys so that a list can be made.

The Annual Budget meeting will take place on Sunday, November 11th following worship. The budget will detail the costs of doing ministry, broken down into the larger ministry



areas such as Education, Social Ministry, and Worship (and more!). Please take the time to review the proposed budget with thanksgiving and prayer for the blessings from Christ at work here at Christ's United. To help us prepare, the ministry budget will be available on November 4th.

Have You Heard the Whole Story?

We have been investigating systems for the hearing impaired. The best option that we found seems to be a Williams FM Broadcasting System. A small personal FM receiver that can be clipped on a belt or stuck in a pocket enables a person to use their own ear buds or light weight earphones to deliver FM sound directly from the pastor's microphone to the participant's system with an adjustable volume. Each person would have their own receiver and ear buds.



The Recipe Swap

This month's recipe: Coffee Cake Submitted by Carla Mae Carl.



Coffee Cake

2 sticks of margarine 2 cups sugar 4 eggs 1 (16 oz.) sour cream

2 tsp vanilla
2 tsp baking soda
1/4 tsp salt
3 cups sifted flour (fold in flour and do not beat)

Topping Mixture prepared separately:

1 cup sugar 3/4 cup chopped nuts 2 tsp cinnamon Mix together in a small bowl

Cream softened margarine, sugar and vanilla. Add eggs and beat well. Fold in sour cream. Sift remaining dry ingredients together and fold into mixture (Do not use mixer for the dry ingredients.)

Place 1/2 of the batter into a greased 9 x 13 pan. Sprinkle 1/2 the cinnamon, sugar and nut mixture on top of batter and gently pull knife through to partially mix into the batter. Add remaining batter and then add the topping mixture, and again pull knife through to add the topping mixture into the batter.

Bake at 350 for 45 - 50 minutes.


