




No.


Easter is a beginning for us. The beginning of forever.


Sr. Youth Group News


Creative Confirmation

To the members of Christ's United:


A great big and sincere thank you to every one at Christ's United for your prayers, cards, and visits. I received more than 100 cards during my 4 month hospital stay, they

A special thank you to Pastor Kim for her hospital visits and prayers. During my first few days in the hospital I recalled almost nothing. However, the one thing that I do recall very clearly is the night that Pastor Kim showed up at my bedside, rather late at night, to give me communion. I knew then that there were a lot of people praying for me and I was determined to beat this illness.
