

Pastor Kim's Message

Brothers and Sisters,

Many years ago, in what was the Soviet Republic, the communist movement was on the rise. The leaders of the movement decided that religion – Christianity – was an obstacle. Determined to put an end to Christianity once and for all, the leaders organized a huge event, preparing the largest arena in the city and telling all the citizens to participate. The most famous orator in all of the republic was scheduled to speak on the benefits of communism, while an old pastor, unknown, was to speak on Christianity.

With fanfare and introduction, the orator presented all the implications of a communist society its advancements, and necessity for the growth of the republic. After two hours, the orator stepped down to polite applause, motioned to the pastor, and said nastily, "don't be long". The pastor, who moved very slowly due to his age, approached the podium and responded, "I will be brief".

Stepping up into the podium the pastor gazed out at the crowd, more people than he had ever seen before. The people, curious, stared intently at this old, feeble man, wondering what he could possibly say.

He began quietly. "I have only one thing to say", and then with an energy and volume that belied his years he shouted "Jesus lives: He who was dead is now alive!"

The crowd, momentarily stunned, erupted in applause, standing and cheering. The old pastor turned to the leaders, who starred in disbelief, then dropped their heads in shame. Christianity could not be destroyed, for Christ has destroyed death: they had no power greater.





Seder Meal

Taking bread and giving thanks, Jesus broke it and gave it to the disciples saying, "take and eat, this is my body broken for you."

We know those words so well that we can recite them on our lips as Holy Communion is prepared; but do we know where they came from?

Prior to his arrest and crucifixion, Jesus gathered with His disciples to share in a Seder, the Passover meal. Reflecting the history of God's love and care for His people, the words and actions of the Seder take us back through Scripture.

Traditionally held in a home with family, you are invited to join the family of Christ's United at our Seder, held on Wednesday, April 1, and participate in this special service of Holy Week. Please register on the bulletin board or contact the church office; a free will offering will be received.

Maundy Thursday

During worship on Maundy Thursday we will celebrate the Last Supper with our last service of Holy Communion until the Day of Resurrection. As Jesus washed the feet of the disciples, so too will the pastor wash the feet of representatives of Christ's United. This special service begins on Maundy Thursday but does not end: we leave the church in silence only to continue worshipping on Good Friday.





Good Friday

What is "good" about the events of this Friday? Come and see! We gather in a darkened church with the altar stripped bare, yet together we will experience the depth and breadth of God's love for us

as we follow Christ's journey to the cross, and give our adoration to the source of life. We leave in silence, holding this moment tightly in our hearts until the vigil on Easter Dawn.

Nothing can compare to the experience of entering a room that is filled by the presence of God's Holy Spirit. On this most holy day, people are asked to come to the church to pray. Please sign up for an half hour or more on Good Friday so that the prayers in the church are never ceasing! Prayer guides, devotionals, a prayer board, and other prayer helps are available as you walk in. Come, be a part of the experience, and be filled.

Christ's United congregational unit (CU) meets the first Wednesday of the month for business meeting, devotions, and

socializing. We raise funds through the Easter candy and bake sales which make it possible to financially support CULC's mortgage payments, congregational dinners, ELCA Malaria campaign, Diakon foster children's gifts, and many other projects and causes. We assemble school and health kits,



baby layettes, and bars of soap for Lutheran World Relief (LWR). Knaughty Knotters creates knotted quilts and are nearing completion of 50 quilts this year.
