



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I struggled with what best to share in my final letter to you. What do you say to a beloved congregation with whom it's been a privilege to serve for three years, and from whom it'll be most difficult to leave?

While the whiteboard is tucked away for now, you probably remember the God Sightings we jotted down on that board. Folks saw God acting all over the place -- in relationships, nature, surprise encounters, and new insights. I experienced a remarkable God Sighting at the funeral for George Tallman last month at St. Peter's Church in Reinerton. Pastor Art Sonnenberg preached, having been both pastor and friend to George. During his homily, Pastor Sonnenberg mentioned that, on their gravestones, George and his wife Carol have listed not only the dates of their birth and death, but also of their baptism!

You may have heard the story of a man who stood to speak at a funeral. He referred to the dates on a gravestone, from the beginning of one's life to its end. He told the mourners that what mattered most was the dash between those years; that what is important is not how much we own, but how we "spend our dash" in living and loving during our lives. Linda Ellis wrote this poem in 1996; since then, a whole network has arisen called The Dash. Jesus had much to say about living simply in love during the days of our lives. And yet...

...what matters most is not what we do with our dash, but what Jesus does to and for us in Baptism. This Sacrament grounds everything we do with our dash. We are justly proud of the titles of our lives -- parent, coal miner, volunteer – but the most precious title we hold is that of Child of God. And when we die, we'll join George and Carol Tallman, and all the other saints of God, in amazing "post-dash" life.

At the most difficult times of Martin Luther's life, he would shake his fist at the devil and shout "I am baptized!". In both trying and joyful times in life, we can cross our arms over our chest and proclaim the same. We are baptized! Amen! Alleluia!

# School Kits needed for Lutheran World Relief

#### Items may be brought in August 8 thru 22.

Education is important in every community but especially those where poverty or disaster limits the options of young people looking to improve their lives. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children continue learning despite the hardships they face. These supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not.

#### The supplies for each School Kit are:

- Four 70 sheet spiral notebooks
- One 30 centimeter ruler (or with inches and centimeters)
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with steel blades)
- One box of 16-24 crayons
- One 2 1/2 inch eraser
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- One sturdy drawstring back style cloth bag (14" x 17")

In the coming weeks the school supplies will begin to be in stores (much to the dismay of many children and adults) at great low prices so keep these items in mind.


## A glimpse of grace

"Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat!" (Isaiah 55:1, NIV). I thought of this verse when I read about a seven-acre farm in Atlanta where people can pick fruits and veggies straight off the trees and vines, like a fresh-air produce market but bigger — and all free!

The Food Forest at Browns Mill, located amid a "food desert" in a city where one-fourth of the population experiences food insecurity, offers 2,500 edible and medicinal plants for anyone in need. People take only what they can use, and volunteers harvest extras to distribute in the community. It's one of about 70 free-food forests in the United States. To me, it looks like a glimmer of God's kingdom.

Imagine a world where everyone's basic needs are met: food, clean water, shelter, clothing, health care, education, meaningful work, love — and the fulfillment of assisting and supporting one another. Isaiah envisions this reality coming true. Sometimes, even in our troubled world, we catch a glimpse of God's abundant grace, tangibly lavished on all. Even better, sometimes we're blessed with the privilege of helping it happen.

In observance of "Gods Work. Our Hands" Sunday (September 12) we are filling Flood Buckets for victims of flooding. We will be collecting items for the buckets from September 1st -19th. A table will be available in the Narthex for donated items.

### The supplies needed for each Flood Bucket are:

- Scouring pads
- Scrub brush
- Dust masks
- Sponges, assorted sizes
- Cleaning towels (reusable, like Easy Wipes®)
- 12 oz. bottle of liquid household cleaner (like Lysol®)
- 25 oz. bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn®)
- 50 oz. (or two 25 oz.) bottles of liquid laundry detergent
- Package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- Two pairs latex gloves (long heavy-duty, like Playtex® dishwashing gloves, not thin ones for painting etc.)
- Work gloves
- 28-bag roll of heavy-duty trash bags (30-45 gallon)
- 6-9 oz. bottle of insect repellent (pump, drops or lotion, not aerosol)




# World Hunger Book & Puzzle Exchange
