



"Come, Lord Jesus" is engraved three times on our family's brass Advent wreath. And one of our mealtime prayers begins, "Come Lord Jesus, be our guest". We Lutherans don't spend as much time as certain other Christians in talking about Jesus' return. This is mostly because we leave the details in God's hands. After all, in Matthew 24:36, Jesus says that he himself knows not the day and hour of his return. Yet Jesus promises he will return. Just scan the 24th chapter of Matthew's Gospel for "Signs of the End of the Age" and "The Necessity for Watchfulness".

Waiting has taken on new meaning during this pandemic. Early on it was waiting to get a hair cut or for more toilet paper to be placed on store shelves. Now it's waiting to be called back to work or for unemployment benefits to arrive. And, for more than one of us in our congregation, waiting for COVID test results.

My prayer is that the practice this virulent disease has given us in waiting might hold us in good stead to anticipate our Lord Christ's return. For that to happen, we'll need to manage the fear, impatience, boredom, and dread that can plague us. If we dwell solely on these sentiments, it will be hard for hope to get through to us. And without hope, as Proverbs 29 tells us, the people perish – if not in body, then certainly in mind or spirit.





As I write this letter, the biopharmaceutical company Pfizer has just announced a COVID vaccine that looks promising. That gives us hope for managing this pandemic. But that doesn't touch the hope we Christians know because God's Son was born for us... and promises to come again. So, when we awake each morning, may we say, "This is the day the Lord has made" followed by, "Come again, Lord Jesus, be our guest".

We will hold Christmas Eve Candlelight Worship Services with Holy Communion on


Thursday, Dec 24, at 4:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.





Create a winter wonderland with this fun craft.



What you need:

- Glass jar with lid but no label
- Laminated photo (that will fit in the jar)
- Small plastic Christmas trinkets
- Hot or waterproof glue
- Container with spout
- 1 cup distilled water
- 3 tsp. glycerin
- Glitter

What you do:

- 1. Unscrew lid and flip jar upside down. Glue the photo and trinkets to the inside of the lid, standing upright.
- 2. In a container, mix water and glycerin. Pour the mixture into the jar, leaving space at the top.
- 3. Spoon in some glitter.
- 4. When glue is dry, attach the decorated lid tightly. Shake the jar to see "snow" swirl and settle.
