


Pastor Kim's Message

Brothers and Sisters,

The honeymoon is over.

It started with all the traditional feelings: nervousness, excitement, and desire... those anxious moments when you couldn't wait to be together again, the constant thoughts. But then the years set in, with all the demands for time and activities, the things that would excite now frustrate, actions become habits, and the excitement, the feelings, and nervousness, the tingle fades...

Relationship turns into existence, romance into routine. Even with feet and commitment firmly set, comparisons creep into our thoughts while eyes and thoughts may wander, taking away time and emotions. The honeymoon is over.

But then... something happens. There is a word, a smile, an action that causes us to flash back to the beginning, seeing in that moment the fullness of love that holds us, completes us, and in that moment, overwhelms us.

That moment is before us.

Its been a long time since we washed in the baptismal waters, the company of heaven smiling upon us and the words of love spoken. 





Relationship Rehab

The theme of God's story is relationship: with God, with each other, and with creation. But our relationship has been broken, and there are a lot of things in our world today that seek to pull us even further apart. So to help us rehabilitate and repair our relationships, the Stewardship Ministry Team is putting out a challenge to Christ's United: Two Hour Turn Off. Once per week, turn off all electronic devices (computers, cell phones, telephones, televisions, etc.) and do something together as a family or with friends. A list of possible activities (like talking, playing a game, or taking a walk) is posted on the bulletin board. There is also a place for you to sign up and make the pledge! 
