

How to raise secular kids in 3 easy steps...


- 1. Fit Church into you schedule whenever its convenient.







<u>Church Council Highlights</u> <u>from January:</u>


- We received a donation from a offering taken at the Ashland Community Choir concert for the Coward Family who were victims of a fire.
- Average weekly attendance for 2019 was 112.9.
- Endowment Fund Committee has contacted Charmaine White to audit at least three years of books (2016-2018).
- An accident occurred at the end of the driveway damaging a light and sign. Ken Dengler will get estimates on replacing the light and sign.
- Our new Pictorial Directory has been delivered and is being distributed to members who had their photo taken to be included.
- The Constitution is being reviewed by Beth Andrews, Terry Shilling and Erik Tice. Changes will be presented at the Annual Congregational Meeting.

Our Lenten focus

Lent, the church-year season that begins on Ash Wednesday, is a time of penitence and spiritual renewal. Some people give up a luxury or vice during Lent as a form of self-denial; others undertake a project that benefits others.



The point isn't to denigrate ourselves or to see how much we can do without. Instead, Lent helps us reflect on Jesus' death. As Timothy Keller writes in The Reason for God: "The Christian Gospel is that I am so flawed that Jesus had to die for me, yet I am so loved and valued that Jesus was glad to die for me. This leads to deep humility and deep confidence at the same time. It undermines both swaggering and sniveling. I cannot feel superior to anyone, and yet I have nothing to prove to anyone. I do not think more of myself nor less of myself.
