

Brothers and Sisters,

"I make all things new"

New Year, new challenges, new excitement, new possibilities – old church? As we think of all the possibilities and that come with the change of our calendar, we don't tend to think about anything new with our

practice of faith. Well, here's something new, just for you:

The start of the calendar year is also the start of new life.

No, not because you've decided to lose weight or exercise more (we've all done that). Not because you promise to be nicer to Aunt Hildegard or Uncle Ebenezer. Not because you will change your hair color or your clothing style. Not because of anything that you – or we – have done. 

What you need:

- Foam letters or letter stickers
- White painting canvas
- Acrylic paints
- Paintbrush or sponge
- Water

What you do:

- 1. Place letters on the canvas to spell out the "ones" in Ephesians 4:4-6 (one body, one Spirit, one hope, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God).
- 2. Paint over the letters, using various colors.
- 3. When the paint is dry, peel off the letters to reveal words that explain important Bible truths.
- 4. If desired, finish by painting some number 1's in any blank spots.

We recycle many things here at Christ's United. Please bring your items in and help keep them out of area landfills.

Items Collected:

Metal tabs from cans

These are sent and used to help raise money for service dogs. Collection bins are located in the kitchen, social hall, and hallway.

Aluminum cans

These are processed by the youth of the congregation and money raised goes to the youth so they can do special projects and trips throughout the year. Collection bins are located behind the church.

Old Cell Phones

Any kind of Ink or Toner cartridge

Phones and cartridges are sent to a recycling facility and we in turn get money back. Collection bins are in the library and the hallway.


<u>April 10-12, 2015</u> at Toftrees Golf Resort and Conference Center nestled in 1500 wooded acres in State College, PA.
