#### HEGINS AREA AMBULANCE ASSOCIATION OFFERS TIPS ON STRESS

As we enter the holiday season and the increased number of COVID-19 cases throughout the country, more and more persons are experiencing stress in their lives. The Hegins Area Ambulance Association would like to assist persons in our area in understanding the causes of stress, in recognizing the symptoms of stress, and in developing strategies on coping with stress. These articles are also designed to give family and friends information on how to spot stress so they might be able to help someone they know experiencing stress.

The causes of stress are numerous. Because of the pandemic, there is an increase in stress because of financial concerns. Small businesses are struggling and workers are being laid off. Political and health issues are also contributing to stress levels rising, as well as the effect of the pandemic on our schools. This coupled with families dealing with the loss of loved ones either due to the pandemic or those loved ones passing away during past holiday seasons makes it all the more stressful.

So what are some signs or symptoms of stress? Here are several with more to be included in a future article:

> -depression/anxiety -impatience -isolation from others -sleeplessness -lack of purpose -over/under eating

-increase in blood pressure and heart rate -disorganization

A way to understand what stress does to a person is to take a 12 oz. glass of water and hold it. The absolute weight of the water doesn't matter. It depends on how long you hold it. If you hold it for a minute, that's usually not a problem. If you hold it for an hour, you will probably have an ache in your arm. If you hold it for a day, you'll have to call an ambulance. In each case it's the same weight, but the longer you hold it, the heavier it becomes.





#### **Church Council Highlights** from December

- Pastor Laura said that she was blown away by the faith and enthusiasm of the three confirmands--Ava Hubler, Kaitlyn Werner and Marisa Seritsky. They are incredible young women and we had a great discussion during Confirmation Class.
- Pastor Laura asks that the follow-up letter to people who hadn't completed their Commitment Cards in mid-November be sent out.
- For Christmas Eve Services it was recommended by the Worship & Music Team:
  - 1. Because of social distancing, chairs will be set up in the Social Hall and possibly the Narthex for overflow.
  - 2. To facilitate Communion in a timely manner, we will have two stations--one in the Nave and one in the Social Hall.
  - 3. LED candles will be purchased to use in place of flame candles to help with social distancing.
- A Motion was made for the purchase of equipment for Facebook live streaming for Christmas services. Pastor Laura shared information from Steven Wolfgang's research of the possibility and equipment. The camera is called the Mevo Start. It is inconspicuous and allows you to customize shots while filming, giving you the ability to zoom, cut, and pan from anywhere in the room. These can all be preset, so it would be easy for whoever is running the camera to switch between shots. This camera will cost \$400 00 and the camera stand is another \$80 00
- Pastor Laura suggested we hold a contest to name our Newsletter. Members of the Mutual Ministry Committee will select the winner.






