- We had a financial gain of \$9,156.68 for November, 2021.
- Joey McAndrew reported that a few members of the Youth Group attended the Jared Box Project Assembly for the Janet Weis Children's Hospital on Sunday, December 5th at the Thrivent Bloomsburg Office.
- On Sunday, November 28th, six students from the congregation each received a \$500.00 Endowment Scholarship check toward their secondary education.
- Ann Marie Dillman clarified that when we did the budget we didn't increase the Outside Custodian's or Financial Secretary's salary because they don't take a salary. It was not to make less of their job. It was to keep the budget in line.
- New procedure for ordering Altar Flowers From now on, everyone will be responsible for ordering and paying for their own Altar flowers. There will be a sign-up sheet near the bulletin board in the hallway so Debbie knows when to put in the bulletin who has flowers for a particular Sunday. 
There are a few items (earrings, pins, etc.- even a puzzle piece) hanging in a plastic bag on the

Live out Jesus' golden rule by preparing gift bags for people in need.




What you need:

What's in a name?

As the U.S. evacuated thousands from Afghanistan in August 2021, an Afghan woman gave birth on a plane. She named her daughter Reach — the name of the aircraft that brought her family to safety.


Many people name their children after loved ones or special events; a child born on Christmas might be called Noel or Holly. In Bible times, too, names often had meanings: Eve likely means "mother of all living"; Abraham, "father of many"; Isaac, "laughter." Moses is a play on words with the Hebrew for "draw out" because Pharaoh's daughter drew him from the Nile.

Of course, the most important biblical name is Jesus, which means "The Lord saves." As the angel told Joseph, "[Mary] will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21, ESV). The Christian church traditionally celebrates Name of Jesus on January 1. But every day, as we pray in Jesus' name, we remember that
