

Pastor Kim's Message

Brothers and Sisters,

Independence. It is a source of pride, the basis of our country, and a noble pursuit borne by men and women throughout the ages. We hold it up to our children, encouraging them from a young age to learn to "stand on their own two feet" and mourn when the limitations of age challenge and steal independence from us and from those we love.

Independence is an understanding that what we face we can handle, that we are confident in our abilities, that we can make it on our own.

holiday. Celebrate your God.






Witness by what you're Wearing!

Would you like to bring joy to seafarers who will not be home with their families for Christmas? Join Christ's United's Social Ministry Team in helping bring Christmas joy to those at sea.

Port chaplains from Seafarers International House bring satchels filled with gifts to the ships they visit in the weeks prior to Christmas. Later, on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day, when the ship is in the middle of the ocean, the captain holds a holiday celebration and every crew member will open their satchels, each containing the following items:

One Sweatshirt – hooded or unhooded (size L-XL), Three Pairs of Socks – thermal or white gym,

Stewardship: Shhh! We don't talk about that here!


It is well known that people don't like to talk about money – but we do need to talk about ministry – the ways that we are called into relationship with God

and with others. Ministry involves giving of ourselves – our time, talents, *and treasures* – in order to give to God.

Giving is not about the amount of money: it is about prioritizing our life in our relationship with God. We do first the things most important to us, whether it involves setting our schedule, helping others, or designating money. Stewardship is the practice of caring for our time, abilities, and money in a way that helps them grow healthy. The Stewardship team at Christ's United is committed to helping each of us achieve a healthy balance in our lives so that we can grow in God. Watch for hints and tips in the coming months!

Here's a sample:

Take a minute to look at your calendar and your bank account? Where is your time and money going? Is it going in ways that help you grow in relationship with God and others, or does it represent a struggle of not enough time, not enough money, leaving you feeling pressured and worn out? Times like this call for a return to the basics. Turn to Genesis 1 and 2 and read about the order of creation. Feel God's desire for a relationship with people. See God's purpose for humans as caretakers (not owners) of the wonders of the world. Think about what it means to be the caretaker of God's property rather than the owner. Discuss ways your time and you money represent your relationship with God.



Answer: "Now learn this lesson from the fig tree: As soon as its twigs get tender and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near." Matthew 24:32, NIV





School Kits needed for Lutheran World Relief

Education is important in every community but especially those where poverty or disaster limits the options of young people looking to improve their lives. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children continue learning despite the hardships they face. These supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not.

The supplies for each School Kit are:

Four 70 sheet spiral notebooks, One 30 centimeter ruler (or with inches and centimeters), One pencil sharpener, One blunt scissors (safety scissors with steel blades), One box of 16-24 crayons, One 2 1/2 incheraser, Five black or blue ballpoint pens, Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers, One sturdy drawstring back style cloth bag (14" x 17")

In the coming weeks the school supplies will begin to be in stores (much to the dismay of many children and adults) at great low prices so keep these items in mind.

Donations of any of these items should be placed on the table in the narthex August 14 - 28.

Thrivent Action Team will pack the bags.
