





Pastor's Ponderings...



Here goes

"How many Lutherans does it take to change a light bulb?"

"Answer" "change, what do you mean change, my great grandfather put that bulb in the light. Yes, change is a strange word that
many people get upset over, fear, or are worried about Many think
of change as negative or being disruptive of one's life and activities.

Change is part of the very nature of being human. As humans, we want to cling to what we know and think we understand. We want what is familiar, constant and consistent such as our daily routines and activities. Yet, change is all around us. It is impossible to escape change. In the most basic sense all creation changes as we go through each season. Are all the sunrises the same? Are all the sunsets the same? Do the same buds bloom the same way each season? Do we have the same amount of snow each winter?

We change jobs. How many people do you now who have worked for the same employer, at the same job for their entire life? I suspect you know very few. We are a people on the move - a tent people, if you will.

Change. Ask the young couple who have just had their first child what change is all about. They do not hesitate to let you now the significant change in their lives and the way in which they live it.

While, one might fight change, get upset over change, or even fear it, if you honestly assess yourself and your situation, there are very few things that are unchanged in your life from ten or fifteen years ago.



The hymn, "Abide With Me", LBW #272, vs 3:

Swift to close ebbs out lift's little day;

Earth's joys grow dim, its glories pass away;

Change and decay in all around I see;

O thou who changest not, abide with me.

These words tell us about God. The promises of God, his love for all creation, especially human creation, his forgiveness, his provision for us, and the gift of his Son for us are constant and consistent and do not change.

God is constantly attempting to change the response of his human creation, and in Christ, changed his approach to his human creation.

In the midst of a world of change there is one thing that we can count on that will not change - the consistency and constancy of the love of God in Jesus the Christ, our Lord and Savior.

Church Council Highlights from June



This very important Youth Ministry is in DIRE need of teachers and helpers.



My Statement of Faith

Ava Hubler
