





Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

With Ash Wednesday late in February this year, early March finds us just beginning our Lenten journey. Recall that Lent means springtime, so these forty days is a time of renewal and hope. When students study hard, they help their Grade Point Average as well as learn important things. In a similar way, engaging in the discipline of Lent provides time to learn more about our faith and deepen our relationships. The Lenten discipline is one of **Fasting**, **Prayer** and **Almsgiving** (the practice of giving money or food to those who are poor).

When I googled the word fasting in Lent, I came across this delightful invitation: "During Lent, feast on joy, compassion, service, and hope". As we strive to eat less during these 40 days, leave out a favorite dish, or perhaps even fast for part of the day, we have time and focus for feasting on the kindnesses listed here.

For praying in Lent, I like this: "List three blessings you have received today. Say a prayer to God, giving thanks for these blessings and those who made them possible." And to further enhance prayer, join us for weekend worship at 5:00 pm Saturday or 9:30 am Sunday, and on Wednesday evenings for soup at 6:00 pm and worship at 7:00 pm.

And for *almsgiving in Lent*, there's this: "Talk with your family about eating one simple meal each week of Lent and giving the money you save to Christ's Cupboard". Perhaps you'll have a



meatless rice, soup, or pasta dish. If you crave meat, remember this is just five meals during the 40 days of Lent.

Remember that Christian discipline during Lent is always for renewal and hope...for ourselves and others. All is made possible through the life, death, and resurrection of Christ Jesus our Lord.



During Lent all are invited as in faith we gather each Wednesday night for a Soup Supper and Worship. The Social Ministry Team introduces the meal at 6:00 by sharing information on ministries around the world, telling us how our actions are affecting the lives of others (for good!). We then gather as

light breaks the darkness in Holden Evening Prayer at 7 p.m. This is a special time of faith, the gathering together deepening our understanding of God's actions of love in Jesus Christ. Please plan to participate in this special practice of Lent.



Church Council Highlights from February

- The collection for the Coward Family fire victims included \$519.00 plus 2 checks and 2 gift cards adding up to \$150.00.
- Simpson Methodist, Gordon and Zion's Reformed, Ashland will be invited to attend our Lenten soup suppers and services.
- Pastor Laura is working on a Youth Retreat to Gettysburg Seminary May 1 - 3.
- The Endowment Committee met on Feb 2 to revise their bylaws. Suzanne Peel presented the previous bylaws and revisions. Charmaine White audited and documented the Endowment Fund books for a 5 year period.
- Nominating Committee Jacob Tice would be willing to serve on Church Council as Youth Representative.
- The Personnel Committee is preparing to conduct annual staff reviews. It was suggested to review the job descriptions before reviews begin.
- Security team—Pre-service Greeters are being selected to create an additional level of security. They would actually be a fifth usher who would greet visitors and be directed to the guest book and visitor packet.
- A sign has been placed in the outside office window instructing individuals to ring the doorbell if the door is locked. Except when activities are taking place, the door should remain locked.
- A donation of \$300.00 was received from Entech Engineering for Christ's Cupboard and Emergency Response.
- The Wedding and Fellowship Hall Guidelines have been reviewed and approved in February, 2020.
- Usher Guidelines were reviewed, updated and approved.
- Plastic candle holders will be purchased for the Christmas Eve Candlelight Service to replace the paper ones to better catch dripping wax.
- Constitution changes for February 2021 will be proposed to the congregation at the Annual Meeting to be voted on at next year's meeting.



Use your voice and this hand-crafted percussion instrument to make joyful noises to the Lord.

What you need:

- Dry beans (about one Tbsp)
- Plastic Easter egg
- 2 plastic spoons
- Masking tape
- Markers and stickers

What you do:

- 1. Place the beans inside the egg and snap it closed.
- 2. Set the egg in a spoon and cover it with the second spoon so the spoons are holding the egg.
- 3. Tape the spoons to the egg. Also wrap tape around the spoons from top to bottom to make a shaker handle.
- 4. Decorate your shaker and use it as you sing praises to God.
- 5. Experiment with sounds by filling other eggs with coins, rice, and so on.




