





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Look on the cover page of this issue of our Church newsletter, and you'll see it's name has changed. In our January newsletter we announced the Name the Church Newsletter contest. Eight contributors provided 20 suggestions. Thank you to everyone who provided ideas. The winning title The CULC Messenger – God's Work, Our Actions was submitted by Deb Hubler. Zachary Hummel and John Denchak also provided titles with the word Messenger in it – Angel Messenger from Zachary and The Messenger by John Denchak.

The Greek word for messenger is Aggelos. It is from this we derive the word angel. Angel and messenger are each used nearly 275 times in the Bible. One meaning of Angel is "a spiritual being who acts as an attendant, agent, or messenger of God". Three such angels are given names: Gabriel, God's messenger to Daniel, Zachariah, and finally to Mary to whom he announces that she will "conceive in her womb and bear a son" whom she will name Jesus; Michael, the archangel, who is often depicted with his foot on the devil with a sword poised to slash him; and Rafael whose name means "God heals".

But the word messenger in the Bible can also refer to humans, to people who are messengers of God. There are countless examples of these in the Bible, as well as throughout history. Think of people who have been messengers of God to you. The parent or grandparent who brought you to church, prayed with and for you, maybe gave you your first Bible. Your Sunday School teacher. The neighbor who stopped by with a casserole dish and prayer book when a loved one



The month of March brings us through further Sundays in Lent and then to Palm Sunday. Days to reflect on the messengers of God in Scripture and in our own time; to see how messengers have touched our lives.... and ways to be God's messenger to others, too. Each month in the pages of The CULC Messenger we can identify messengers in our midst, and opportunities for us to engage in God's work through our actions.





Church Council Highlights from February

- We're still in need of an Indoor Custodian. The woman who accepted the position backed out for personal reasons.
- John Denchak read a proposal from Dengler Electric for replacement of damaged light and support at driveway entrance/exit for the cost of \$475.60. John received a check from Progressive Insurance for \$475.60 which was given to the Treasurer.
- Originally we had voted that the proceeds from the Whoopie Pie sales would go to the Capital Fund Campaign. Terry Shilling made the motion that we instead donate whatever proceeds we make from the Whoopie Pie sale to the Houser Fire Fund. The motion was seconded by Beth Andrews with all in favor. Motion carried.
- Canceling of Worship Services: Some people weren't notified about church being canceled on Sunday after the decision was made by both Pastor Laura and John. We had a problem with the message not put on our Facebook homepage and no text messages were sent out. John had sent an email to all of Council. He thought we should review the process. Next time we will have the message on Facebook and a text message will go out, but that doesn't take care of those who don't have a smart phone for text or a computer. Pastor Laura said we have a message on the answering machine about cancellations and that could be explained when we do announcements. Terry suggested trying to post cancellations on WNEP. She also suggested making a list of the people we know who don't have access to Facebook or text messages, then set up a phone chain. John decided that we will have a sign-up sheet for people to place their name and phone number so they can be contacted. Pastor Laura will ask Deb to make the sign-up sheet and Jacob will make an announcement about it on Sunday. Terry also suggested that information should be in the Newsletter about notifying the church if someone wishes to be contacted.














"The Passion of Our Lord" is read each year by members of the Congregation during Palm Sunday Worship.





Though St. Patrick's Day has become a secular "holiday," March 17 commemorates the life of a Christian missionary. St. Patrick grew up in a Christian home in Britain but wasn't very devout until he experienced crisis. As a teen, he was captured and sold into slavery in Ireland, escaping after six years. "The Lord

opened my unbelieving eyes" in Ireland, Patrick later said. God led him back there, and he converted tribe after tribe to Christianity.

In *Confessio 61*, St. Patrick writes, "I testify in truth and in great joy of heart before God and his holy angels that I never had any other

Whoopie Pie Fundraiser


