



Dogs' best friend

A 71-year-old graduate in Turkey has become an inspiration to many. Fevzi Uyar had retired after teaching biology for 42 years but decided to pur-




sue another degree. Known as the "grandfather" of homeless animals, he routinely traveled 90 miles every two days to feed stray dogs, who came to recognize his van. Uyar also built dozens of plywood shelters, complete with rugs and blankets, for the dogs.

But Uyar often encountered dogs needing medical care and racked up debts with a local veterinarian, so he enrolled in classes himself. The recent graduate now vaccinates and treats the animals he loves so much.

"God spoke: 'Let us make human beings in our image, ... so they can be responsible for ... every animal that moves on the face of Earth'" (Genesis 1:26, MSG). Fevzi Uyar's care for stray dogs beautifully reflects God's intent for creation.




I really appreciate all of you giving me the opportunity to serve as your inside custodian.


