
Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,


One of the hardest periods of high school had nothing to do with classes or homework, but had everything to do with a period in the middle known as lunch. Here we were set loose to find a place to sit, eat and fit in. It could be brutal. The biggest fear was either being turned away from a table or being forced to eat alone, while the biggest high was having our place saved.

During this COVID pandemic many school students are not permitted to eat in the lunch room; they must dine in their classroom or at home. And Thanksgiving will prove very different this year as well. There will be loved ones missing from the table because travel is too dangerous or they are not permitted to leave their home.

In John 14:3 Jesus tells us, "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also". Jesus assured his disciples he would prepare a place for them and there is hope there for us as well. We who have longed to fit in, who struggle with finding a place at the table, can finally belong. Jesus comes to reassure us that we have a place at his table. We and every other sinner have a place to sit beside our Lord – both in the Holy Communion celebrated in this life, and in the feast that has no end with our Lord Christ in life eternal. Thankfulness, studies show, has multiple physical, mental and emotional benefits. Psychologist Robert Emmons calls gratitude "fertilizer for the mind" because of its powerful effects.



He admits gratitude isn't always easy — especially when life throws us curveballs (see the year 2020) — but says it can be most helpful during and after difficulties. Emmons suggests reframing challenges using thankfulness-based language. Ask, for example: Though I wasn't grateful for the experience at the time, how can I be now? What lessons did I learn, and how did I grow as a person?

Throughout his letters, the apostle Paul reframes his extensive sufferings and urges us to do the same. "Give thanks in all circum-




Indoor Custodian Position


