



Pastor Kim's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The winds of change are blowing.

People are walking around with sweaters on. Hot chocolate returned to the menu and afghans again cover our couches. Oil and coal trucks are busy on the roads. Home windows are being shut. The times, "they is a changing".

We can see it clearly as the sun now shines more gently on ever changing leaves, a rainbow of beauty that graces our drives and is a banner for the changes that are happening not only around us, but in us as we change – our habits and our thoughts – with the seasons.

It brings to mind the verses from Ecclesiastes 3: For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: ²a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; ³a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; ⁴a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; ⁵a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; ⁶a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; ⁷a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; ⁸a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.

The writer goes on to say how we realize the seasons change around us, as we change for them, but we fail to realize that God too flows around us, from the beginning through the end. Yet we fail to change for Him: We focus on the Life God surrounds us with forgetting the life God fills us with, a life that too, requires change.

Realizing the gift of life that God has given us in Jesus Christ requires – demands – a change in us: from our hearts out through our hands. It causes the scales to fall from our eyes like the Apostle Paul (Acts 9.18) and for us to see clearly that God stands before. Seeing, we are to turn our lives to follow him: to be His disciples.

Discipleship is the goal of the Committed to Christ program. During the time of this program a presentation is offered each week on how we can follow Christ more closely. Members will guide us each week in worship by sharing from their own experiences, an adult class is meeting during Sunday School to join in prayer and understanding, and individual booklets with explanation have been sent to every household. The tools of Prayer, Bible Reading, Worship, Witness, Financial Giving, and Service are all ways that we can conform our lives to His, if only we will change.

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." John 20.21-22

May the winds of the Holy Spirit change you.



God's precious saints


