Pastor Kim's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It's time!

The nights are getting chilly, the sky has that soulful tone, the sun's warmth is accompanied by a gentle breeze, and the trees are starting to put on their brightest colours. The season is changing and bringing with it all the beauty and wonder of the season. October is a wonderful month of change as we transform from shorts to sweaters, "football" (soccer) into "football" (Penn State), and Summer into Fall.

It is also the season of change for the church too, especially for us as Lutherans, as we gather to celebrate the festival of our heritage, Reformation. There will be songs and processions, red will adorn the church, and all because we as a people – we as a church – have a day set aside to celebrate change.

It's almost an oxymoron for the church: a celebration of change in an institution that has been firmly rooted in an unchanging belief for more than 2,000 years? No, that's not quite it.

It is a celebration of change that allows us as a people - a people who have constantly been changing for the past 2,000 years with technology, music, academics, science, styles – to recognize that God's love is for every generation, every age, every one of us; that belief is more important than tradition; that God is bigger than our understanding; and that the message of Jesus Christ is as important today as it was in ancient Israel.

Celebrating the Reformation is a commitment to constantly re-form as a church, to constantly seek new ways to reach people with an old

truth: God loves us so much, that God gave His only Son, Jesus Christ, for us to have life in Him. More than a day, it is a journey with twists and turns, steep hills to climb up and sometimes tumble down, meeting people along the way, together sharing joys and sadness, helping each other with burdens we bear, and together traveling on the path of God.


A Scary Good Time!





A letter to the Members and Friends of Christ's United,

Jesus says: "for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me." (Matthew 25:35)

During the past year the Social Ministry
Team of Christ's United has had many discussions about the growing
need of our surrounding communities and families within our
congregation. We have talked about the lack of income, loss of jobs, and
the hardships that many face each day, especially to provide food for
their families. We feel that there is a great need to help serve those
around us by following Jesus' example. Therefore, we feel it is
necessary to begin an emergency food pantry here at Christ's United.
This food pantry will supplement families during difficult times and that
"in between" time that they get food from their local pantry. The area
food pantries that serve many families give out a generous amount of
food either monthly or bi-monthly. This food is greatly appreciated, but
at times does not supply some families with what they need to make it to
the next distribution date.

The food pantry distribution here at Christ's United will be held on the second Thursday of each month; or if there is an emergency, by appointment. The hours of distribution will be from 10:00 a.m. -12:00 noon. Our first distribution will be Thursday, November 13. We will have financial guidelines set up to be eligible for food distribution. Food distribution will be given out on a personal choice basis so that the families may take only food that they will use and not have any waste.

We have been blessed with a generous congregation that supports us in the many ministries that we participate in and have great faith that this will continue with "Christ's Cupboard". We ask that you pray for our communities, those who struggle with hunger and this ministry so that we may reach out and help those who are in need. If you have any questions, or know of someone in need, we ask that you contact the church office at 570-875-1591.


