



Pastor Kim's Message

intent noun in tent \in-'tent\

Simple Definition of INTENT

: the thing that you plan to do or achieve : an aim or purpose

Source: Merriam-Webster's Learner's Dictionary

Crime shows make a big deal of intent. Those seeking forgiveness make a big deal of intent. The idea of *intent* is one entwined in our daily lives: whether it is present of absent affects the meaning of what we do and what we are held responsible for doing.

The importance of intent is in our daily actions. And it is in our daily lives of faith.

In Romans 10, verses 9 -10 its states: "If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved."

"Words are cheap" as the saying goes, "what is in your heart is what matters". What we do can happen without thought or planning. But living in faith is accepting and acting out God's plan for our lives. Romans echoes this saying by stating that it is the belief in our hearts <u>combined with</u> the words from our mouths that evidence our salvation. This means that we need to have more than routine or learned language: we need to have *intent*.

Intent is the focus of two upcoming ministries at Christ's United: The Committed to Christ program, beginning on 18 September, and the Connections Ministry, just starting.

Committed to Christ helps us explore our lives of faith. More than just attending worship, the program teaches us that being believers of Jesus Christ comes through in every aspect of our interaction with

others and care of ourselves. Using the practices of Prayer, Bible Reading, Worship, Witness, Financial Giving, and Service we grow in our faith by intentionally using the gifts that God has blessed us with each and every day.

Each week we will focus on one of these gifts. A resource table will be available in the lobby, filled with information about the theme of the week and people to help us understand more about these gifts of God. A special Journey class will be held where laughter and activities will help adults see God's actions in our daily lives. Prayers and Facebook posts will give us encouragement and reminders of our purpose in God's plan for creation.

Similarly, each one of us has reached out to a friend in need to help him out. We do it because we care and we can. The Connections Ministry helps us reach out not just because we can, but because Jesus Christ reached out to us. Connections Ministry is intentionally connecting with our neighbors with the care of Jesus Christ.

Offering not just a present but a prayer on a birthday. Lending an ear and Christ's United's resources in a difficult time. Making sure that no one goes through life alone, but with the family of God that we are here to be.


After all, isn't that what God intended?
