



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our refrigerator door is cluttered with magnets, reminders of places we've been and wise sayings we've heard along the way. One of the quotes is by Eleanor Roosevelt. Several years back during a vacation in the Hudson Valley of New York we visited the getaway home Eleanor named Val-Kill. She had the home built to get away from her mother-in-law Sarah whom she detested (I think the feeling was mutual). Her quote on our refrigerator magnet is: *Do one thing every day that scares you*.

Just living in these days of pandemic is scary beyond measure. Eleanor herself lived through the flu pandemic of 1918 and the Great Depression. It was as difficult a time as our own. Given that, why in the world would she encourage us to daily do one thing that scares us? One reason, I think, is that as a fellow Christian, she knew the challenges of a life of faith -- of caring for those most unlike ourselves; of forgiving those who have hurt us to the core; of telling others what Christ means in our life. It *is* scary to interact with those most different from ourselves, for that means seeing how these differences challenge our lifestyle. It *is* scary to forgive, for that means re-entering the relationship in a new way. It *is* scary to tell others what Christ means in our life, for we might get laughed

at, be asked a question we cannot easily answer, or be stereotyped in a way that embarrasses us.

Yet imagine what could happen if each of us would do one good thing every day that scared us? + Listen to a news station different from the one we normally watch. + Get our Church Directory out and call someone who lives alone and can't venture out due to COVID-19...or whom we don't know (gulp!). + Send flowers to the neighbor we like least. What scary, good things can you think of? I invite you to take a small booklet (there are little Thrivent ones in the hallway free for the taking), and jot down scary, good things you think of. Then share these with others (you can list that as another scary, good thing!).

Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go. The words are of the prophet Joshua, the one chosen to lead the people across the Jordon River into the promised land of Canaan. We too, with the Lord's guidance, can be strong and courageous to do one good thing every

Resuming the Celebration of Holy Communion

On September 6 at our 9:30 a.m. service we look forward to again receiving Holy Communion. As a Church of Word & Sacrament, it has been difficult to refrain from this Means of Grace. Yet front & center in the minds of our Safety Task Force, Worship & Music Team, and Council has been doing our part to contain the COVID-19 Virus. All three groups have worked hard to formulate a plan for distribution that will be evaluated afterwards.

Here's what to expect:

- 1. An usher will tell you when to approach the Chancel. Safe distancing will be kept as you come forward (except for family members). The usher will offer hand sanitizer before you leave your pew.
- 2. Pastor Laura will place a wafer into your hand using a tong.
- 3. You will then walk to the Assisting Minister who will place a pre-filled cup of wine or grape juice on a small table for you to then take.
- 4. Then remove you mask to partake of the wafer and wine.

More directions will be given before the service on September 6. Amid all these logistics may we remember it is Christ's very Body and Blood that we receive for the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation.

When God crosses our paths

Pastor and martyr Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote, "God will be constantly crossing our paths and canceling our plans by sending us people with claims and petitions." Last spring, the whole world had plans canceled, first by Covid-19 and then by God "sending us people with claims and petitions." Some needed prayers for healing or for coping with grief. Medical staff, teachers, pastors and others serving long hours needed support: meals, check-in calls, "thinking of you" cards. Parents working remotely while helping kids with distance-learning needed encouragement. Crucial nonprofit work still required donations.

Pre-pandemic, you may not have realized that staying home or wearing a face mask could be a ministry. Or that sending a card expresses love in Jesus' name. Or that buying takeout from a local restaurant can be a gift to the owners. When our calendars empty, God "crosses our paths" in new
