Friends,

As our congregation battled through the pandemic, there were times when we thought things could not get much worse. Then they did. As vaccines became available we began to see things begin to loosen up, we were able to get back to the business of the church, "worship." This fall, for the first time in over a year, we will be bringing back our social hour after church.

Now, a pastoral transition has occurred in our congregation. I want to assure you that the resources of the bishop, synod staff, district dean and your church council will be working to secure new pastoral leadership here at Christ's United Lutheran Church. I have no doubt about the lay leadership at our church and I know that they and others will certainly do their best and help us during this transition to a successful outcome. Jesus said, "Do not be afraid."

Briefly, I would like to explain what the steps will be in this transition process.

- 1. Meet with the mission district dean and synod staff person. On August 9, 2021, your church council met with Pastor David Rowe, Dean of the Schuylkill Mission District, Pastor David conducted the required exit interview with Pastor Laura. Following that meeting we met with Pastor Kathleen Ash-Flashner, Associate of the Bishop. She discussed pastoral care and introduced materials used in preparing a study report. This first step has been completed.
- 2. Gather information for the Parish Study Report. Information will be gathered from all interested members of the congregation. Two short forms will be distributed to members prior to Sunday worship:

3. Elect a Call Committee.

Six persons shall be elected by the church council to fill the role of calling a pastor and completing the Ministry Site Profile. If you are interested in serving as a member of this committee, please let me or any of our council members know.

4. Meet with the bishop.

After the Parish Study Report is completed, the bishop or designee will meet with the council, call committee, and all interested members of the congregation to discuss financial realities, roles defined and questions to be asked.

5. Identify a candidate.

The bishop will search for a candidate that is suitable.

6. Work of the Call Committee.

This consists of preparing for and interviewing a candidate.

7. Council meets with a candidate.

Council holds a formal vote in order to recommend the candidate to the congregation.

8. Informal reception.

A reception is held in order to meet and greet the candidate.

9. Congregational Meeting.


Here a vote is taken to extend a call as pastor of our church.



Please be advised, you must be an ACTIVE MEMBER of the congregation and be present on NOVEMBER 28th when scholarships are given out at worship service








In observance of "Gods Work. Our Hands" Sunday (September 12) we are filling Flood Buckets for victims of flooding. We will be collecting items for the buckets from September 1st -19th. A table will be available in the Narthex for donated items.

The supplies needed for each Flood Bucket are:

- Scouring pads
- Scrub brush
- Dust masks
- Sponges, assorted sizes
- Cleaning towels (reusable, like Easy Wipes®)
- 12 oz. bottle of liquid household cleaner (like Lysol®)
- 25 oz. bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn®)
- 50 oz. (or two 25 oz.) bottles of liquid laundry detergent
- Package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- Two pairs latex gloves (long heavy-duty, like Playtex® dishwashing gloves, not thin ones for painting etc.)
- Work gloves
- 28-bag roll of heavy-duty trash bags (30-45 gallon)



Prayer bracelet

Make this craft to help you remember the Lord's Prayer.



What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

What you do:

- 1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
- 2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
- 3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):
 - **blue** = the Father
 - **white** = God's holiness
 - **gold** = God's kingdom
 - **green** = the earth
 - **yellow** = wheat (bread)
 - **red** = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
 - **black** = temptation
 - **orange** = God's power to deliver
