Pastor Kim's Message

Brothers and Sisters,

Boo!

Soon our streets will be filled with little ghosts and goblins of every type; eerie sounds will emanate from the neighbor's front door; and children will be given enough scares and candy to keep them awake for a year.

This time of year would fill us with anticipation-laced fear when we were little, but now we shrug it off with a chuckle and smile. Rubber masks and little ghosts yelling "boo" just don't scare us any more... they have been replaced with other things, things that don't just scare us, they terrify us:

Feeling that lump that won't go away... The bills that keep coming faster than the money... When your teenager comes in slowly, and says "mom..."

Adult fears don't take our breath way, they take our life away.

Each day, each step, is with fear. Fear is such a part of our everyday existence that –consciously or unconsciously – it guides our every action. Fear limits what we dream, how far we go, and how deeply we feel. While our faces may smile and laughter may erupt, it doesn't fill us. It can't fill us. Fear won't let it fill us.

Fear keeps us on edge, constantly churning us inside so that there is no quiet, no calm, no peace. We are filled with motion, like the waves on the sea, filled with thoughts and pain and anxiety. Fear is gas on a spark, burning us up from the inside out.

When disciples were walking on the road, upset, confused and fearful because Jesus had been crucified, Jesus appeared to them and said, "Peace be with you". (Luke 24).

When the disciples were locked in the upper room for fear of the Jews, Jesus appeared to them and said, "Peace be with you". (John 20)

Jesus is not only our source of peace, Jesus is peace.

Martin Luther was tormented by the demons of fear, to which he would literally yell out loud: "Go away Satan – I am baptized!". For in baptism we are blessed with the words "Child of God, you are sealed with the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ <u>forever</u>."


Forever. It is a promise, a guarantee, a love that not only breaks through fear it destroys fear. No matter what happens, what noises call to us, what challenges come before us, the presence of Jesus in our lives quiets the fear in us: it is our security, our hope, our belief that there IS a future for us.



Insight on Confirmation

In May or October, many churches celebrate confirmation, a practice with biblical roots. For example, Peter and John are sent to "[lay] their hands on" new believers and "[pray] for them, that they might receive the Holy Spirit" (Acts 8:15, 17, NRSV).


In the early church, new Christians, most of whom were adult converts, received baptism and confirmation as one ceremony. As more children were brought for baptism, the practice became for pastors and priests to baptize but for only bishops to "confirm" a baptism, or make it official, granting the baptized full membership in the church.

Later, confirmation became a rite by which adolescents, often following intensive Christian education, profess for themselves



the faith into which they were baptized. Some denominations prefer the term "affirmation of baptism." Confirmation serves as a milestone of faith, when young adults begin embracing a life of discipleship with a sense of purpose. Join us as we celebrate the
