


The Journey begins!

Harvest Home September 19 & 20

"Christ's Cupboard"

WOW! What an exhilarating feeling! 3,822 lbs. of food! 95 families served! 253 people fed!

Most of you may know that we have a food pantry here at Christ's United. We have distribution the second Thursday of every month from 10:00—Noon. This past month in August we held our regular distribution and we also held a special event the following Thursday where we gave out all perishable items, and the statistics are above. Usually we are unable to order a lot of perishables because we do not have any refrigerator storage space. We do have three freezers that hold about 450 lbs. of frozen products, but even that amount does not go far when we serve between 80 and 90 families a month. All our food comes from the Greater Berks Food Bank at a fraction of the cost that it is in the stores. The reason we held this special give away was that Berks was offering all of their produce, dairy, and frozen products for free during the month of August. The truck arrived a little after 9:00 a.m., we unloaded, and then distributed it to 95 families. (the most we ever had!) These families are made up of 253 individuals that we could supply with food that they normally would not be able to afford in the grocery store.

We have been very blessed to help those within our communities with this service and all of them are very appreciative of what we do for them. The volunteers that come out every month are a great blessing to this ministry, for without them, we would not be able to do this.

We ask you the members of Christ's United to continue to keep this ministry in your prayers and bring in your donations to fill the shopping cart. What started out not even a year ago has become a wonderful blessing to Christ's United and the surrounding communities. Thank you!

Flag Pole Prayers

Each September for the past 25 years, young Christians across America have gathered around school flagpoles to pray. See You at the Pole (SYATP), which began at three schools in Burleson, Texas, is now an international event, with about 3 million participants annually. Students organize prayer gatherings, usually at 7 a.m. local time. Teachers, parents and youth pastors often join them. The theme verse for this year's event, which occurs September 23, is Acts 1:14 — "They all met together and were constantly united in prayer" (NLT). Student-led prayer, even at public schools, is free speech protected by the U.S. Constitution. By gathering around their flagpoles, young people take a stand for Christ as they call on his name in prayer.
